### **PRESENTATIONS AND AWARDS**

#### **DR. TERRI JOHNSON & MIKE POTTER; PRESENTATION OF INTERIM GROWTH IMPACT STUDY BY MADISON SCHOOL GROWTH COMMITTEE**

The Madison Schools Growth Impact Committee was formed by Mayor Finley, Madison City Council, Madison City School Superintendent and the Madison City Board of Education on July 20, 2017. The Committee was tasked with developing a plan to keep the Madison City Schools the best K-12 educational value in the State by understanding the impact city growth has on the school system and determine the needs the school system will have over the next 10 – 20 years.

The members of the Committee are Madison County Commissioner Steve Haraway, former Madison Commissioner BeBe Oetjen, Madison Board of Education member David Hergenroeder, Industrial Development Board member Dr. Sandy Patel, Alice Lessmann, Steven Ryder, Larry Miles, Valerie Miles, Shaquinta Morgan, Madison City Council Member Greg Shaw, Dr. Shelia Nash-Stevenson, Al Sullivan, and Co-Chairs Dr. Terri Johnson (former Madison City School Board of Education member) and former Madison Council Member Mike Potter.

Co-Chairs Dr. Johnson and Mr. Potter presented the interim growth impact study prepared by the Madison School Growth Committee. The Committee hopes to have a final report by mid-October to be followed by open town hall meetings and dialogues with special interest groups.

**PROCLAMATION BY MAYOR DESIGNATING SEPTEMBER 2017 AS "GYN CANCER AWARENESS MONTH"**

Mayor Finley read aloud a portion of the proclamation he recently signed designating the month of September 2017 as "GYN Cancer Awareness Month" in the City of Madison.

**MAYOR PAUL FINLEY:**

**UPDATE ON THREE SPRINGS SCHOOL**

Two youths, who were escapees from the facility, were arrested earlier this month for the murder of Georgia resident Van Johnson, a construction worker hired to work on the renovations of the Publix Shopping Center on County Line Road.

The Police Department has continued dialogue with management from Three Springs who state that they have added safety features recommended by the Police Department. An advisory board is being created and currently consists of Police Chief Jernigan, Council Member Maura Wroblewski, Mayor Paul Finley, Madison residents Butch Parris, Piper Moore and Reverend John Ryberg. From this point forward, regardless of a youth's placement in the facility (whether runaway or escapee), if and when someone leaves the facility without approval they will be deemed an escapee and a public alert will be made.

State level discussions are ongoing, both with DHR and DYS. Three Springs has stated that they meet DHS and DYS minimal standards. Mayor Finley added that the advisory board and the City will ask, and expect, that Three Springs require more than the minimum requirements.

City Attorney Megan Zingarelli, at the request of Mayor Finley, stated that she will present an Ordinance to Council at their next meeting which would set procedure to give the City the ability to revoke, or not renew, a business license if the safety of the public is at risk.

**MR. TIM FARRELL; ADDRESS COUNCIL REGARDING THREE SPRINGS SCHOOL**

Mr. Farrell spoke to Council regarding concerns he has regarding Three Springs facility. Mr. Farrell added that the Publix Shopping Center that the murder occurred at held a collection for Mr. Johnson's family and over \$800 was collected. He also mentioned that since 2012, there have been escapes every year, with the exception of 2015. This year alone there have been five escapes. Mr. Farrell stated that when you add the recent arrest of the

Three Springs employee having sex with residents, "it is very clear that something wrong is going on at Three Springs".

**MR. BUTCH PARRIS; ADDRESS COUNCIL REGARDING THREE SPRINGS SCHOOL**

Mr. Parris spoke to Council regarding concerns he has regarding Three Springs School, most notably the increased number of runaways/escapees and the representatives of Three Springs stating in the press conference that they are meeting the *minimum* standards. He thanked Mayor Finley and the City Council for allowing him to serve on the newly formed advisory committee.

**MS. DONNA MAHIEUX; ADDRESS COUNCIL REGARDING THREE SPRINGS SCHOOL**

Ms. Mahieux was not in attendance.

**MR. SYED HASAN; ADDRESS COUNCIL REGARDING MADISON UTILITIES**

Mr. & Mrs. Hasan addressed Council regarding an ongoing issue they are having with Madison Utilities and the requested repair of a water meter at their residence as well as a request for a refund of overpayments made to the utility. They informed Council that they have filed a report with the Police Department for what they believe is criminal activity by Madison Utilities. Council President Overcash advised Mr. & Mrs. Hasan that if they believe that criminal activity has occurred they need to continue to pursue their efforts with the Police Department as well as continue to work with Madison Utilities to resolve this issue.






