PICTURE PERFECT KUTZ PUBLIC HEARING

City Attorney Zingarelli stated that on May 29 a public hearing was set in order to consider what to do about allegations of illegal gambling at Picture Perfect Kutz and The Braid Shop. Madison Police investigated and the case was referred for prosecution and a guilty plea was obtained in City court. Also, the Madison County DA obtained a default judgement on money that was seized at this location. She requested Chief Jernigan to make a statement.

Minutes No. 2018-14-RG July 9, 2018 Page 11 of 15 Chief Jernigan stated that he believes that the business in question has been operating as a front for illegal gambling. They executed a search on March 13, and seized seven illegal slot machines; also, evidence of narcotic transactions was found on the premises. He urged Council to revoke the business license.

Bivens Mayo, the owner of the business, appeared before Council to apologize and ask that Council not revoke his business license.

Bebe Oetjen, a citizen of Madison, appeared before Council stating that Madison does not need a business that engages in illegal activities and that the business license needed to be revoked.
