PRESENTATIONS AND AWARDS

PRESENTATION OF PROCLAMATION DECLARING OCTOBER 23, 2012 AS SPECIAL OLYMPICS DAY

Mayor Finley read aloud a portion of the Proclamation declaring October 23rd "Special Olympics Day" in the City of Madison. David Brooks and Georgina Chapman were in attendance to receive the Proclamation.

PRESENTATION OF 2012 FAMILY OF THE YEAR

Family of the Year Committee Chairperson Lisa Bath stated that over a two-week period 48 Madison families were nominated for this year's Family of the Year. The 2012 Family of the Year is the Hergenroeders; David, Melanie, John, Laura and David. A round of applause was given.

PRESENTATION BY MAYOR & COUNCIL

Mayor Finley and Council President Ondocsin presented "Memories of Madison" books to retiring Huntsville Times employees Yvonne Betowt and John Peck. Yvonne has worked for the Huntsville Times for 36 years, covering the City of Madison for the past 3 ½ years. John has been with the Times for 28 years. Yvonne was also presented with a key to the City by Mayor Finley. A round of applause was given.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Public Comments are limited to five minutes each if the speaker requested to be added to the Agenda prior to deadline. Individuals requesting to speak at the meeting who did not make the agenda deadline are limited to three minutes.

TOM SCOVILL; TAXES AND POLITICAL ACTIVITY BY SCHOOL EMPLOYEES

Political activity by school employees

Mr. Scovill informed Council that at least one school employee distributed an email on the school server encouraging all of their co-workers and contacts to vote "Yes" on the September 18th statewide referendum. Mr. Scovill stated that this is politicking on an issue that is put before the voters and added that it is "flat wrong". Mr. Scovill also stated that Limestone County School Board Superintendent Dr. Sisk wrote to his employees

encouraging everyone to vote yes as well. Mr. Scovill has written to the Attorney General and the Limestone County DA's office on the matter of Dr. Sisk. Mr. Scovill believes there is a training and discipline problem in the Madison City Schools as this is a recurring and inappropriate problem of political activity involving school resources.

½-Cent Sales Tax

Mr. Scovill stated that there seems to be a problem with the ½-Cent Sales Tax that was approved for city schools. He believes the answer to the City's problem of excess revenues is to reduce the tax so there aren't any excesses and return that money to the taxpayers. He urged Council to look out for the entire city and not just one special interest.

CARY HILTON; USE OF PUBLIC EQUIPMENT FOR POLITICAL ACTIVITY

Public Resources to promote political activity

Mr. Hilton agreed with Mr. Scovill's comments and stated that there are rules and regulations in place to prohibit the use of public resources promoting political activity and he doesn't believe this line should ever be crossed.

½-Cent Sales Tax

Mr. Hilton stated that in addition to wanting to promote schools and support education he would like to see more objectivity in the numbers and in the reporting budgets. He believes this would take a lot of the emotion and subjectivity out of it.

GUN ABELE; ½-CENT SALES TAX

Ms. Abele stated that the biggest asset the City of Madison has is the school system and without supporting the system the City will lose what drives it and draws individuals to move here.

LARRY STICKLES; ½-CENT SALES TAX

Mr. Stickles voiced his displeasure with the Madison Board of Education once again asking the City for money and believes that James Clemens High School was built to excess.

STEPHANIE WOODS; ½-CENT SALES TAX

Ms. Woods urged Council to consider the ½-cent sales tax increase. She sees this opportunity to use the revenue to support the schools which in turn supports the community.

DR. EMILY COOK; ½-CENT SALES TAX

Dr. Cook spoke in favor of the sales tax. Dr. Cook is proud of the amenities that James Clemens High School has and does not see it as a "Temple of Excess" as has been mentioned this evening.

JANOE STAUCH; MADISON CITY SCHOOL SYSTEM

Ms. Stauch stated that the City has a fantastic school system but she would like to see the existing schools be improved as well. With an increase in sales tax the improvements can become a reality.

DAVID HERGENROEDER; ½-CENT SALES TAX

Mr. Hergenroeder spoke in favor of the ½-cent sales tax and ultimately giving the school systems the flexibility to maintain and support the city schools.

AMANDA KAY; ½-CENT SALES TAX

Ms. Kay also spoke in favor of the sales tax increase. She believes the quality of life in the city is contingent upon the education system.
