MR. DON SHOOK, 104 LYNBROOK BOULEVARD: DRAINAGE ISSUE

Mr. Shook and his neighbor Tim Carr, distributed information to Council regarding the drainage easement in Hillchase Subdivision. They believe there might be a possible code violation in that a berm installed on nearby property has diverted storm water. City Engineer Gary Chynoweth stated that he will look into the matter and Mayor Finley added that he would work on this with Mr. Chynoweth.

MS. HOLLY DENENNY, 25738 NEWBY ROAD: QUARRY IN LIMESTONE COUNTY, HUNTSVILLE CITY LIMITS

Ms. Denenny, a resident of Madison County, appeared before Council asking for their support in working with the City of Huntsville and Limestone County regarding a rock quarry located near her home. She stated that back in 2011, a rock quarry started at Browns Ferry and Gray Roads in Limestone County, in the Huntsville city limits. The residents of the adjacent neighborhoods were able to put a stop to the quarry but this past February blasting started from the site.

A recent study by an Auburn professor has shown that surrounding property values plummet by 25% for homes within 1/4 to 1/3 of a mile of a quarry. A home's value within 1 mile is reduced by 15%, a home's value within 2 miles by 10%. Ms. Denenny added that Oakland Springs, a new subdivision located in the city limits of Madison, is within 1.3 miles of the quarry.
